INNOVATIVE LEARNING FORMAT – Each webinar includes:

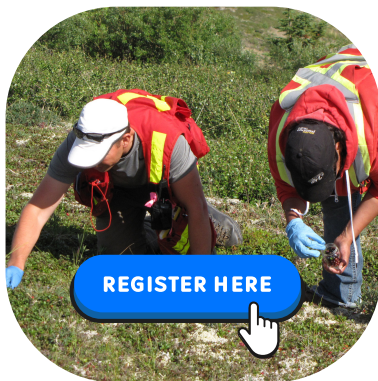


- On-line “live” participation (two Zoom sessions per webinar, each session is two hours long for a total of four webinar hours)

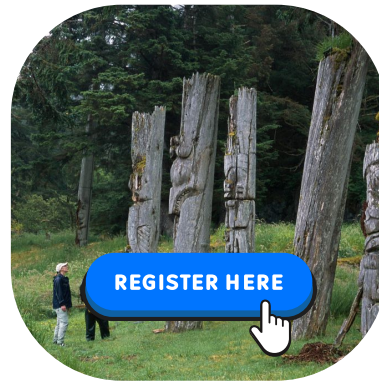
