Governance - First Nation Regime: _____

Land Management Regimes:

1. **(RLEMP)** Reserve Land and Environment Management Program - Regional Lands Administration under the Indian Act.
Authority to approve land transactions remains with Indigenous Services Canada (ISC).
2. **(53/60)** Delegated Lands Management Program - (sections 53 and 60 of the Indian Act).
First Nations are delegated the authority to approve transactions on behalf of the Minister.
3. **(Self-Government)** Self-government Agreements.
Negotiated with individual First Nations.
4. **(FNLMA)** First Nation Land Management Act - The First Nation & Canada sign a Framework Agreement. Canada must ratify the Framework Agreement with the First Nation.
The First Nation develops its own Land Code and then must enter an Individual Transfer Agreement with Canada and it must be put before membership for a ratification vote.

Levels of responsibility with RLEMP:

- Training and Development Level
- Operational Level
- Delegated Authority Level

5. **(Treaty)** Land management under Treaty.
